

## AMERICAL DIVISION NEWS

CHU LAI (AMENICAL IO)—Americal Division units accounted for 20 VC and one NVA killed, 10: suspects detained, and one individual and one crew-served weapon captured yesterday in southern I Corps.

"Charger" units of the 196th Inf. Bde. accounted for 14 VC and one NV. killed and one 60mm mortar tube captured in the Operation Wheeler/Wallowa area yesterday.

llth Inf. Bde. "Jungle Warriors" accounted for four VC killed, nine suspects detained and one individual weapon captured in their area of operations yesterday.

Rlements of the 1st Bn., 20th Inf., oper tin; 15 miles northwest of Quang Ngai City, accounted for three VC killed yesterday.

The 1st Bn., 20th Inf. command and control helicopter commanded by LTC William D. Guinn (Greeneville, Tenn.) killed the first VC.

The 11th Inf. Bde. cramind and central helicopter, also providing support for the "Sykes Regulars," engaged two VC. One was killed and the other detained by the helicopter commanded by COL John W. Denaldson (Alexandria, Va.).

The third VC was killed by a lst Bn., 20th Inf. company when the "Sykes Regulars" spotted him hiding in a spider hole with a false cover made from wood, dirt and grass.

Early yesterday afternoon a 4th Bn., 3d Inf. company, commanded by CPT Alfred N. Yebb (LaJolla, Calif.) observed a VC hiding in a fortified bunker. He was engaged and Milled when he refused to surrender.

Meanwhile, another "Old Guard" company, commanded by CPT John J. Murphy (Springfield, Penn.) detained

three VC suspects just outside the western perimeter of LZ Bronco, at Duc Pha

Later another company of the battalion, led by CPT Robert F. Cocdruff (Columbus, O.), detained four VC suspects during a combat sweep two mileswest of Duc Pho.

Into yesterday afternoon the brigrade S-2 detained one VC suspect 12 miles southeast of Duc Phe during an aerial reconnaissance mission.

One 4th Bn., 3d. Inf. company found a French MAC pistol five miles south of Duc Pho.

198th Inf. Bde. soldiers killed two VC and detained one suspect in their area of operations yesterday.

"Professionals" of a 1st Bn., 46th Inf. company, led by LLT David O. Bergeron (Fairfield, O.) killed one VC west of Tam Ky.

Another company of the battalien, led by CPT Roger Dimsdale (Washington, D.C.), found a tunnel containing two Chicom compasses, maps, 50 pounds of small arms aumo in the same area.

Nearby, one VC suspect was evacuated for interrogation after he had been detained by "Brave and Bold" soldiers. The suspect had been hiding in a cave.

"Regulars" of a 1st Bn., 6th Inf. company, led by ILT Larry Stovall (Hendersonville, Tenn.) killed one VC: while making a sweep west of Chu Lai.

## \* \* \* \* CLEARING FOR DEROS

When you DEROS, you are authorized to take back to the United States, 66 pounds, plus an additional 134 pounds of baggage. This is not hold baggage and can be carried on the plane. baggage allowances wary with your rank.

Upon receiving your reassignment orders report to your hold baggage area for crates. If you do your own packing, have eight copies of your orders en hand.

If the hold baggage station does your packing, have 11 copies.

Next step after receiving orders and taking care of your baggage , is to clear with your unit or base camp. Your orderly room will issue three conics of DA Form 137, Installation Clearance Record. All areas requiring cluarance will be noted on this form.

Have your shot record up date! If it is not, your DEROS could be delayed.

Have all your debts paid before

you get on the plane.
Finall, be sure to fill locator cards for your unit mail room so that your mil can reach you after are back in the states.

after you have cleared your unit, report: the the replacement / returned processing office.named on your port call orders. This is the shipping point back to CONUS. Do not report carlier than 24 nor leter than 12 hours before your deporture flight.
