CHU L.I (.MERIC.I IO)—Eighteen WC and one NVn were killed, four individual weapons captured, and eight suspects were detained in Southern I Corps yesterday by Americal Division units.

Nine VC and one NVA were killed and three individual weapons were captured by 196th Inf. Bde. "Charger" units in Operation wheeler/Wallowa yesterday.

". 3rd Bn., 21st Inf. company killed one VC with M-60 machine Eun fire 12 miles west of Tam Ky. The VC was wearing a grey uniform.

a short time later the "Ginlet" company spotted a group of NV. moving up a trail. A hasty ambush was set up, resulting in one NV. killed and one KK-47 and one SKS rifle, and four Chicom grenades captured.

another 3d Bn., 21st Inf. company killed one VC with M-60 machinegur; fire as he fled a hut 14 miles west of Tam Ky. The VC was wearing a khaki uniform,

MANIL.—Notorists in six asian countries killed more persons in traffic accidents 1 st week than the the tot 1 of American and South Vietnamese soltiers who fell on the battlefields of Vietname.

Japan accounted for the bulk of highway deaths.

Last week's battlefield toll in Vietnan listed 177 mericans and 176 Republic of Vietnan troopers killed in battle, a total of 253. The figure for the year stands at 13,026 mericans and 15,467 South Vietnanese killed in action, a total of 28,473.

A United Press International survey of Taiwan, Thailand (Bangkok only), the Philippines, Hong Kong, Seoul and Japan showed that a total of 348 persons were killed in highway slaughter. Incomplete and projected figures show a figure of 13,388 highway deaths for the first 42 weeks of the year.
