MERIC.L DIVISION NEWS

CHU L.I ("MERIC", L IO) — Units of the Lerical Division accounted for eight VC and two NV killed and 19 suspects detained in the southern I Corrs area yesterday.

"Charger" units of the 196th Inf.

Bde. accounted for six VC and one NV. Units of the 198th Inf. Bde. rekilled in Operation sheeler/wallows. Forted capturing over two tons of rice.

A4th Rn., 21st Inf. company killed one vC eight miles southwest of Hoi.n.

The recon lt. of the 4th In., 2st Inf. engaged a 7C seven miles south of Hoi .n with small arms fire, resulting in one vC killed.

The 2d Br., lst Inf. command and control helicopter killed three vC with M-60 machinegum fire 22 miles northwest of Tem Ky.

18 Liles northwest of Hoi .n the command and control helicopter killed another vC with M-60 fire.

In the norming the 3d Bn., list Inf. command and control helicopter killed two VC who were hiding in a canal seven miles north of Duc Pho.

In a late report from Tuesday, "..ero Scouts" of the 123d ..vn. Bn. killed one MA in a green uniform 40 miles northwest of Duc Pho.

In other action the 4th Bn., 3d Inf. command and control helicorter deteined three VC suspects near a trail four miles south of Duc Pho.

The 1st Sqdn., 1st .rmored Cav. reported 16 C suspects detained in the Burlington Trail area 10 miles northwest

of Tam Ky.

"Dragoons" of B Trp., lst Cav. accounted for 13 of the suspects detained. "Blue Ghosts" of F Trp., 8th C.v. accounted for the other three C suspects detained.

Early in the corning a lst Bn., 46th Inf. company led by HLT Larry Grage (Metalina, Wash.) found and destroyed one 175m artillery round and a "Bouncing Betty" nine northwest of Chu Lai.

Civic action soldiers of the bricade treated 480 Vietnamese during four MEDC.Ps.

The division suffered one soldier wounded and evacuated for medical treatment.

But until men were actually put at the controls and the ship was subjected to the rigors of space, no one could be certain the collo would work as expected for 11 demanding days on its own.

then its filots-walter Schirra, Donn Eisele and walter Cunninghanclimbed aboard ... ollo 7 Oct. 17, they were reasonably certain that the risks to their lives were slight. But they had no idea the ship would operate as well as it did over the full 163-orbit route.

There is no doubt that the moon program will move on to an even more ambitious mission with .pollo 8. ... and, as one official said, it is almost a foregone conclusion that mollo 8 will soon receive clearance to fly around the moon and back.
