AMERICAL DIVISION MENS

CHU LAI (AMERICAL IO) -Americal Division units accounted for 20 VC and two NVA killed and one individual weapon captured in the southern I Corps Tactical Zone yesterday.

A village cordon operation by the 4th Dn., 3d Inf. led yesterdays action as 11th Inf. Ede. "Jungle Farriors" killed 16 VC and detained 55 suspects in Quang !gai Province.

The 4th Dn., 3d Inf. cordon opera-tion, seven miles southeast of Duc Fho resulted in 11 VC killed and 29 suspects detained. A commany led by LLT Robert F. Callahan (Ft. Meade, Md.) killed killed eight of the VC near a trail as the cordon got under way. Another company of the Dn. killed two more VC on separate actions near trails as the round-up proceeded. Ore 4th Bn., 3d Inf. company found the body of a dead VC near huts. The VC had been killed by 6th Dn., 11th Arty. fire the previous night. At the end of the cordon operation a total of 29 VC suspects had been detained by the "Old Guard" soldiers.

In action late Friday night, troops of a 3d Dn., 1st Inf. company detained 15 VC suspects eight miles north of Duc Pho. In the same area another company of the Bn. detained one VC suspect and killed two VC.

A third company of the "always First" Bn. detrined nine VC suspectsseven near a village three miles northwest of Duc Fho, and two who had no . ID cards five riles north of Duc Pho.

"Sykes Regulars" of a 1st Bn., 20th Inf. comeny killed one VC after he ran from a hut ll miles northwest of Quang Ngci City.

"Shark" gunshirs of the 174th Avn. Co. killed one VC near a beach seven miles southwest of Duc Pho:

Gunships from the 14th Avn. Dn. killed one VC five riles southwest of Dinh Son.

A 4th Bm., 21st Inf. company engaged a group of NVA yesterday with small arms fire. It was estimated the group numbered about 30. The contact resulted in one NVA killed seven niles southwest of Hoi An.

Dde. aerial observers spotted a possible energy base camp 10 miles southwest of Hoi An. Artillery fired into the area resulted in one W killed.

A 4th Bn., 31st Inf. company found an SKS rifle six miles southeast of Hier Duc yesterday.

The 198th Inf. Dde. reported that "Aero Scouts" of the 123d Avn. Bn. killed one NVA southwest of Tam Ky.

"Dragoons" of the 1st Sqdn., 1st Armored Cav. reported two VC killed and two suspects detained in their area of operations yesterday.
